Ban on corporate and union donations.	Only eligible individuals can donate. Corporations, unions and other non-individual voters are prohibited from donating.	<i>A</i>
Cap on individual contributions: less than \$1,000 a year.	Limits annual donations to \$2,500 for a political party, \$2,500 for a candidate or constituency association, plus \$2,500 for leadership and nomination races. Could potentially total \$10,000 depending on the year.	<i>D</i>
Ban on anonymous donations.	No ban on anonymous donations.	<i>F</i>
Ban on foreign and out-of-province donations.	A complete ban on donations from foreign and non-B.C. residents. Donors must be residents of B.C. who are Canadian citizens or permanent residents.	<i>A</i>
Donations should be publicly disclosed in real-time.	All parties who receive more than \$50,000 in annual donations must disclose all donations in 14 days.	<i>B+</i>
Ban on in-kind donations and employee lending.	Loans of staff or services are subject to the same laws as financial donations, meaning unions and corporations are not allowed to lend staff. However, loopholes still exist. Loans allowed from savings institutions.	<i>C</i>
Lower campaign spending limits.	No changes to campaign spending limits.	<i>F</i>
Laws should be imposed retroactively back to May 9, 2017.	No retroactive provision.	<i>F</i>
Includes revisiting and reviewing legislation every ten years.	No updated requirement.	<i>F</i>
These laws also apply to municipal campaigns.	No municipals donation limits included.	<i>Incomplete</i>
